Merchants fall to Streetsville

The Merchants were hoping to put the brakes on a couple of troubling trends in Streetsville Tuesday.

First and foremost was their recent rash of lacklustre starts particularly on the road — while a not-too-distance second was their four-game winless skid at Vic Johnston Memorial Arena.

In either case, Milton was unable to deviate from its present course and was shaded by the now sixth-place Derbys 4-3.

The evening clash nearly came with a double whammy for the Merchants, when rookie right winger Vince Laise took a fluke tumble into the boards late in the opening frame and — despite making it back to the bench unaided — was initially thought to have sustained a neck injury.

Fortunately, no such damage was revealed during an examination at Mississauga's Credit Valley Hospital — although a mild concussion will likely keep him sidelined for both games this weekend.

Goals not coming early

Meanwhile, Laise's cohorts were mediocre through the early stages of play and for their second straight away game were scoreless in the first period.

This plus a lack of finish down the stretch cost them the win and a chance to strengthen their hold on top spot in the Ontario Provincial Jr. A League's Western Conference.

Milton held a bird's eye view of the division as of last night, although three teams were within two points — with both Brampton and Buffalo enjoying a game in hand.

Captain John Nadalin delivered his third goal in four games and seventh overall this season to get the visitors on the scoreboard.

Also burying the biscuit were freshmen Scott Malcolm and Kevin Arruda — who along with team scoring leader and former Derby Andy Rozak are the only two Merchants who've played all 27 games this season.

Shots on net favoured Streetsville 33-30 while the winners got another above average performance out of veteran stopper Terry Lenyk. Counterpart Joel Cameron, who's been logging all the cage work lately, was solid for Milton.

The Merchants have now lost three straight on the road while six of their seven losses this season have come away from Memorial Arena.

While the Merchants don't have a top-10 scorer this year, they do have half-a-dozen players on pace to finish with over 20 goals ...
