



"Anyone who is doing something to help their community or better themselves or their community," said Ms Naykalyk.



REVIEW OF UNIFORM TRAFFIC CONTROL

BY-LAW NO. 1984-1

By-law 1984-1 regulates traffic and parking on streets under the jurisdiction of the Town of Milton. The by-law includes parking restrictions related to the following:

- A three hour parking limit on all streets in Milton unless otherwise posted
- No parking on any street between November 15
 and April 15 between the hours of 2 AM and 7 AM
- No parking on sidewalks

The Department of Community Services is preparing a review of By-law 1984-1 as it relates to parking restrictions and enforcement. Under consideration during this review are several issues including:

- The issuance of parking permits and under what circumstances they might be appropriate
- A policy to determine where parking restrictions on streets would be most effective

Written comments from the public regarding these issues or any other issues related to parking on municipal streets are being sought. Submitted comments will be considered in the preparation of any recommended changes to By-law 1984-1 for Councils consideration. Staff expect to have a report available for consideration by the Community Services Standing Committee of Council on February 26, 2001.
