





# Catholic board considers policy for trustees to be mindful of

their perception

Halton's Catholic school board trustees are considering adopting a policy that requires them to keep their mouths shut and paste a smile on their faces.

The policy, described as School Board Operating Procedures, states that trustees should "understand the importance of a positive public perception of our school board."

It adds that board members should "support the director of education, superintendents, principals, school staff and other board members both in public and in private," and "appreciate the impact that board members' statements have on colleagues, staff and the community."

While that may sound like board members are being urged not to publicly express dissenting opinions, Burlington trustee Bob Van de Vrande says he doesn't see it as a way of silencing elected representatives.

"I certainly don't see it as muzzling," said Mr. Van de Vrande, who made a motion last week to table the operating principles to a future meeting.

He said he simply wanted more time to study them and

offer feedback, as trustees had only just received them.

"Trustees have certain roles and senior staff have certain roles and we're intended to work cooperatively," he added. "We have to support our senior

The policy also states that trustees will "leave disagreements in the board room when the meeting is over" and "agree not to spring surprises on the board or director of education."

#### Code of ethics

The school board is also considering adopting a code of ethics for trustees, which calls on them to actively participate in the Catholic Church and "affirm a strong sense of Christian community."

While the operating principles for trustees are a new concept, the code of ethics has been around for a number of years, said board chair Al Bailey.

The 10-item code was originally created by the Catholic school board trustees' associa-

"(The code) may or may not be adopted in a motion as such, but they are still things we strive to live by on a day-today basis," said Mr. Bailey.

Both items will be considered by the board at its meeting January 23.
