Miltonians coming to aid of earthquake victims

It's half way around the world, but the earthquake in India is touching the hearts of people in Milton.

According to Brent Page, community services director for the Milton branch of the Canadian Red Cross, Milton residents are already responding to their request for funds to assist victims of the devastating earthquake.

Measuring 7.9 on the Richter scale, the quake flattened entire cities January 26.

Media reports suggest the death tally is somewhere around 25,000 and those injured at more families. than 30,000.

"We receive very positive response from the monetary contributions. people in Milton," Mr. Page said. "When we see

devastating scenes like this, we want to help."

Eighty-five cents on every dollar makes it to the front-lines in India, Mr. Page said. Donations are sent electronically through banks.

The money is used to purchase food, blankets and other personal items such as toiletries. It's also used to set up field hospitals and provide people with clean drinking water.

Forty dollars can purchase blankets for a family of four; food for a family of four for one month; clothes for a family of four; plastic sheeting for eight families or cooking utensils (plates, kerosene burner and kerosene, cutlery) for six

In these situations, the Red Cross only accepts

"We want to purchase locally," Mr. Page said.

Not only does it help out the local economy, but assists in meeting the dietary needs of people in India.

Furthermore, the cost of shipping goods overseas is quite cumbersome.

For those who have relatives in India, the Red Cross offers a tracing service.

"We deal with the devastation when they come into the branch," Mr. Page said. "These people have been on the phone trying to get hold of their loved one. When they place a tracing request it's something real to them."

The length of time to establish a link overseas varies, according to Mr. Page. However in this emergency crews are still digging through the rubble.

"Once we get shelters set up, people in India can register with us. Then we can trace their family in Canada."

People who want to make donations to the India Earthquake Relief Fund can do so by visiting the local Red Cross branch at 42 Bronte St. or by calling 1-800-218-1111 for credit card donations.
