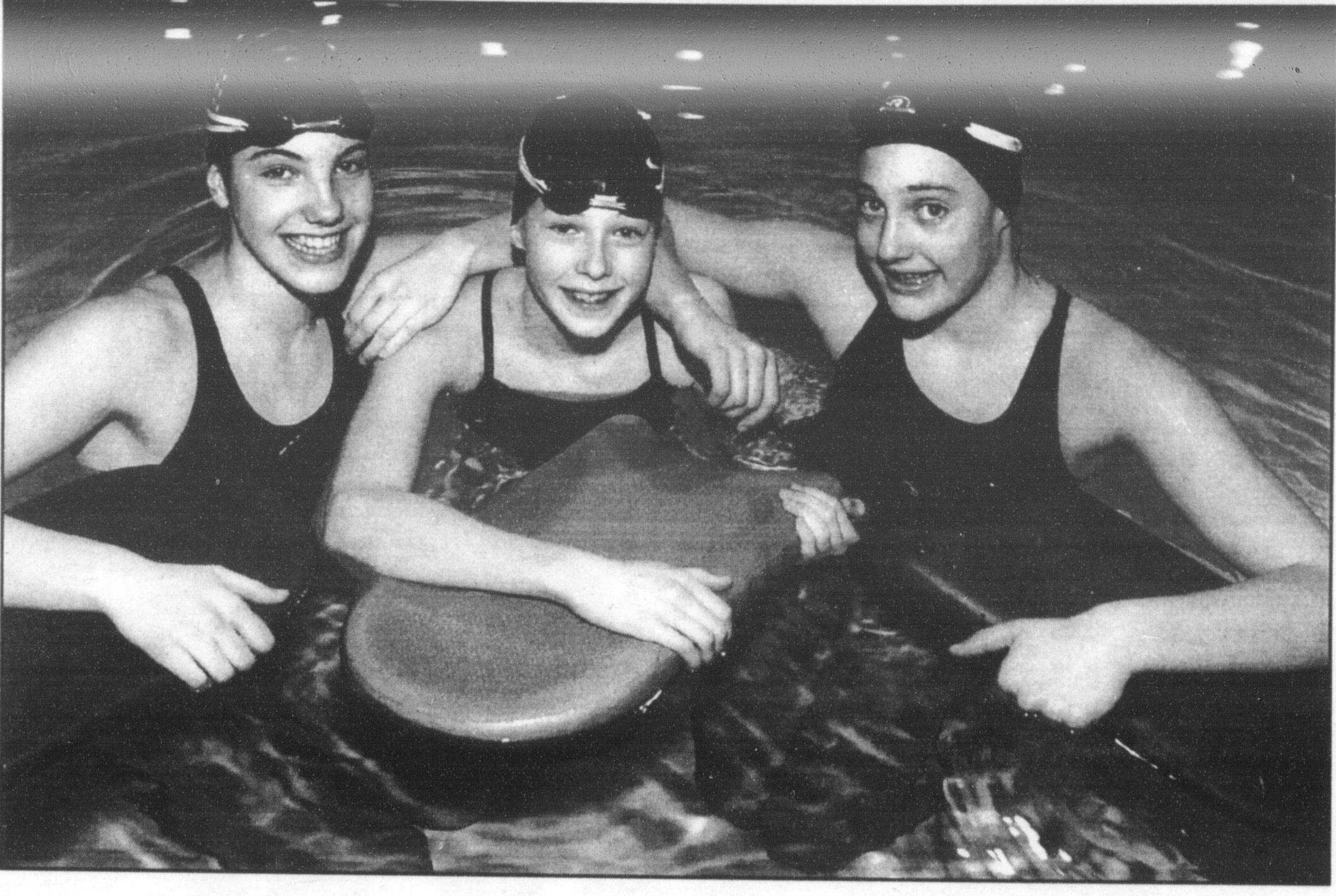

## Porenta powers way to freestyle victories versus 2000 Olympian

Miltonian Jennifer Porenta ushered in the new millennium not with the toasting of champagne but with the sinking of topflight swim competition.

The 15-year-old did so earlier this month at the University of Toronto's Downtown Performance Meet.

There she shocked audience members, coaches and fellow pool sharks by stealing first place in the 50-metre freestyle away from national record holder and 2000

Olympian Laura Nicholls.

The two combatants were dead even in the short course preliminaries, before the local teen eclipsed her more seasoned rival by three tenths of a second in the long course finals - stopping the clock at 27.33.

#### Also prevailed in 100m

The 100m freestyle was a case of déjà vu, with Porenta keeping pace in the preliminaries and then winning the finals this time by nearly one-and-a-half seconds with a personal best effort of 58.49.

She also showed strongly in four other events, setting two new individual benchmarks along the way in the 50m butterfly and 400m individual medley.

Porenta — who recently switched over from the Milton Marlins to the Toronto All-Stars in order to be eligible for this spring's nationals — closed out last year in equally remarkable fashion.

Short course competition in Guelph saw her amass half-a-dozen gold medals that collectively secured her high point status among all 15-year-olds.

Meanwhile, Milton's swim team had three other medalists at the event.

Aaryn Fraser, 12, struck silver in the 100m freestyle while her performance in the 400m freestyle was good enough for bronze.

Taking second-place honours in the 13 and 14-year-old girls' 400m freestyle was 13-year-old Rachel Robinson, and age class teammate Kristen McIlroy, 14, captured three bronze medals.

Among other competing at the two recent meets were Tara Anderson, Jacqueline Clarke, Kate Chapman, George Dimitrov, Jennifer Claessens, Erynn Mayes, Jamie Robinson, Joshua Robbins, Karl Zebreth.
