Andy Rozak provided the heroics, netting his 23rd goal of the season with a close-range deflection. He ended up just three goals shy of team scoring leader Andrew Francone, while fellow first-liner and Western Conference Rookie of the Year Kevin Arruda potted his 21st early in the opening frame to cap a thoroughly sensational freshman campaign

Dan DeLong tallied twice and added an assist while checking line partner Dan Bognar also had three points, picking up a couple of helpers on nifty centering passes before burying one himself late in the third.

Milton's other marksmen were Ian LaBrash and Jamie Williams. Drawing two assists apiece were James Coleman, Scott Malcolm and Adam Sturgeon.

Derek Myronuk led for the visitors with a pair of goals and two assists. Singles went to Craig Courteau, C.J. Morrison and Trevor Wilkieson.

The Cougars capitalized on three of five powerplay opportunities to keep things interesting on a night when a rash of goals and creative passing made up for a lack of structure and physical play.

Shots on goal favoured Milton 38-25.
