

Mattamy Homes building site target of tool thieves

Approximately \$3,000 worth of tools were removed from the Mattamy Homes construction site on Derry Road overnight March 10.

The tools were stolen from a locked trailer, which was broken into by unknown suspects.

Power washer stolen

A Honda power washer valued at \$985 was stolen from Romac Industries on Steeles Avenue overnight March 22.

The theft occurred between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.

Police seek break-in suspects

Halton Regional Police in Milton are investigating a break and enter at BiWay on Main Street East.

The incident occurred sometime between 5:50 and 6:25 p.m. February 1.

An unknown suspect entered the office area and somehow damaged the operational mechanism on the door handle of the safe.

Two males were observed exiting the back room but had left the store prior to the damage being

- Comfortable working with, and have empathy for individuals and community groups

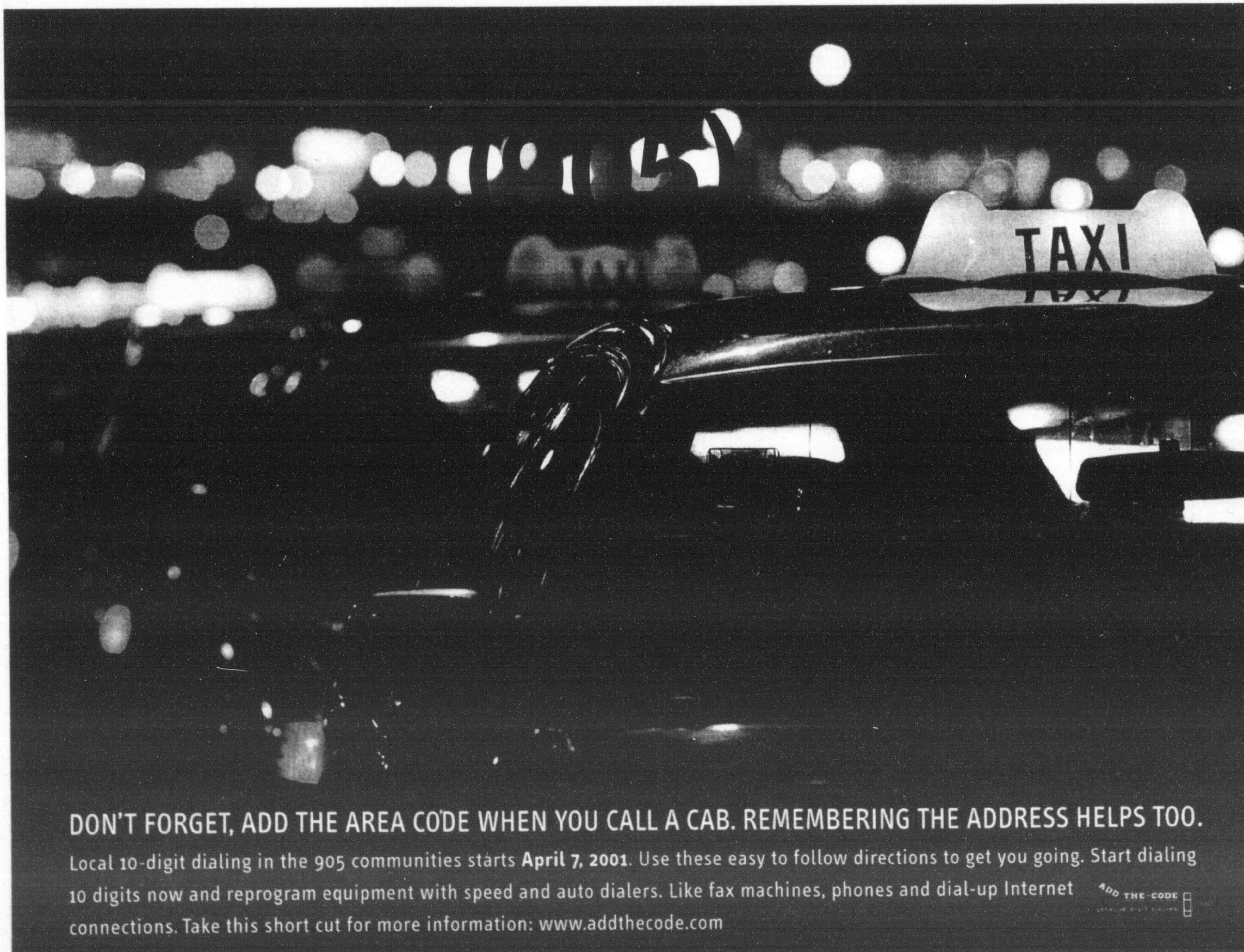
