A changing Canada saving itself, says Reding speaker

By changing the immigration laws more than 30 years ago, Canada might have saved itself from a potential downfall of a nation by turning into the most ethnically-diverse country in the world, freelance journalist

and lecturer Gwynne Dyer told Bishop Reding Secondary School students Wednesday.

"I live in England so I have a different perspective of Canada because I live outside of it," he said. "Changes happen day by day and you don't notice them like I do. The country is changing faster than

anywhere else and that will probably save your bacon."

Two shadows are hovering above the future, Mr. Dyer said.
