## Merchants eliminated by Couchiching

## Milton drops three straight on way to semifinal exit

It's been said good things come in threes.

The Merchants, however, found a devastating loophole to that theory — one which denied them access to the innermost sanctum of Ontario Provincial Jr. A League playoffs.

Unable to douse the immense firepower of the north conference champion Couchiching Terriers, Milton dropped three straight games — equaling its longest losing streak this season — for a heartbreaking semifinal series exit.

The local club's departure was finalized during game six at a

packed Memorial Arena Monday.

Like the preceding two tilts, an edge in shots on goal just didn't spell success — as once again a second-period letdown had grave consequences.

The Merchants gave up three goals in the middle stanza — including the eventual winner with just a few seconds remaining — and were trimmed 5-4.

"Couchiching's an explosive team that converted on the turnovers that we couldn't," said general manager Nick Slawson. "But overall we had a great year and accomplished a lot."

Andy Rozak capitalized on the hosts' only powerplay six minutes into the contest while also making firstperiod deposits — with an upstairs backhand and doorstep rebound respectively — were Shane Remenda and Dan Bognar.

Unfortunately, Milton couldn't sustain its offensive pressure

over the balance of the evening and inside its own blueline allowed the visitors a bit too much room to maneuver.

This proved costly early in period two as Terriers' top gun Jason Pinizzotto — who shook off a temporary dry spell with three assists in game five the previous afternoon — walked in uncontested and potted two by Joel Cameron.

Then David Wrigley connected on a lengthy wrister at 19:44.

The Merchants weren't quite done yet, as checking line centre Dan DeLong buried a goal-mouth scramble exactly four minutes into the final

However, this only served as a prelude to heartbreak — as Couchiching provided a strong enough measure of defensive zone coverage to hang on for the victory.
