## Town council okays both entrances in land development

#### Milton Tennis Club will be relocated

After years of debate and numerous changes in a controversial housing development, town council voted Monday to approve access from both Childs Drive and Ontario Street, and to relocate the Milton Tennis Club.

The issues go back several years when Dave de Sylva of H.D. Investments proposed to build a subdivision of single, detached condominiums geared for senior citizens on the 33-acre site of the E.C. Drury Park lands.

The housing project was brought before council several times and was rejected, but the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) reversed council's decision and allowed the development.

The OMB set a date for March 31 for Mr. de Sylva, council and the Milton Tennis Club to reach an agreement regarding

Childs Drive access and the development of the tennis club. That date had recently been extended to April 28.

Mr. de Sylva submitted two proposals for council's review that show changes regarding the tennis club.

The first plan provided for 204 lots with access from both Childs Drive and Ontario Street. It entailed the preservation of the existing path, creation of a new east/west path, preservation of the existing lighting, creation of a new parking lot for 60 cars all in conjunction with an access to Childs Drive to be shared with the tennis club and the condominium development. There would be no cost to the Town or the club to implement the development.

The second proposal had 207 lots with access from both Childs Drive and Ontario Street. It entailed the relocation of the club to another area of the land. H.D. Investments would pay for six new tennis courts complete with fencing, lighting and perimetre drainage, a new club house of 2,000 square feet and a new parking lot for 60 cars with access to Childs Drive.
