

Krane, Tanner named Business Persons of Year

Jamie Krane and Elayne Tanner were all smiles as they accepted the awards for Business Man and Business Woman of the Year.

"I'm really very shocked. I truly didn't expect to be here," Ms Tanner said after receiving the Milton Chamber of Commerce Community Award Saturday night. "It's such an honour even to have been nominated. I don't know how the final choices were made."

The registered social worker moved to Milton 12 years ago from Toronto and opened her private practice, Elayne Tanner and Associates.

"Milton proved to be all that we hoped for," she said. "Our business is out in the country, it's in a relaxing setting. Everybody but my family said I couldn't do it (start own business)."

Ms Tanner joined the Chamber of Commerce to meet the community members and promote her practice.

"Never give up on your dreams and never let anyone define your abilities."

Mr. Krane said he was at a loss for words.

"It's a real thrill to be up here to accept this award," said the Subway Sandwiches and Salads co-owner. "I want to thank my wife (Lianne) who is also my business partner and soulmate. We make a great team."

Mr. Krane took the opportunity to recognize his staff.

"That really sets us apart from other business'," he said. "Everyone is willing to go out of their way to make customers happy. We have such great people in Milton."

Twelve years ago, the Kranes opened the Subway outlet on Main Street.

They sold the store at that location more than a year ago but still operate the Subway on Market Drive and have won Subway's Franchise of the Year award for Central · Ontario.

Mr. Krane helps organize annual Canada Day celebrations at Rotary Park and is a regular supporter of the Milton District Hospital Foundation and various community functions.

Also nominated for Business Woman of the Year were Lianne Krane of Subway and Helena Donaldson of the Donaldson Financial Group. Eric Walton of Comic Express was also nominated for Business Man of the Year.
