Schools, cemetery hit in spree of vandalism

One school trashed; Evergreen Cemetery headstones toppled

The weather heated up considerably over the weekend, and so too did Milton's vandalism problem.

In one of the worst local sprees in recent memory, three schools and Evergreen Cemetery were targeted.

A total of 27 headstones were turned over at the Ontario Street cemetery many of them cracked — Sunday morning.

Meanwhile, Halton Regional Police have arrested a local young man in connection with Martin Street School being trashed overnight Friday.

Kitchen appliances were destroyed, as were drinking fountains, windows and doors. Damage was estimated at \$20,000 to \$30,000.

A suspect was found leaving the school with a computer at about 4:57 a.m. Saturday.


