Recent vandalism at Evergreen Cemetery and local schools leaves us, quite frankly, feeling both disgusted and exasperated.


The pathetic culprits turned over 27 headstones at the Ontario Street cemetery late Saturday night, and about \$25,000 damage was caused to Martin Street School. E.C. Drury High School and Sam Sherratt School were also recent targets of vandals.

Evergreen Cemetery and schools have been vandalized before, but the problem seems to be getting worse as reports of damage to cars, mailboxes and other property are constant and numerous.

Attempting to understand vandalism is difficult, but, then again, it's hard to make sense of something senseless. Destruction of other people's property is clearly a lack of respect, but what drives people to do it? Do vandals gain pleasure from it, and if so, why?

We're at a loss for answers, however the St. Peter's School Council will try to deal with the problem at a special meeting Monday night. Police will be on hand at the meeting, held at the school at 7 p.m.

We hope a large crowd will turn out as the more people putting their heads together to try to resolve the issue the better.
