Dufferin Aggregates has submitted an application which proposes an extension to its existing Milton Quarry aggregate operation. Included with the application are amendments to the Niagara Escarpment Plan, Region of Halton Official Plan, Town of Halton Hills Official Plan, and the Town of Milton Official Plan and Zoning By-law. The proponent has also submitted a Development Permit application to the Niagara Escarpment Commission, and a Class A License application to the Ministry of Natural Resources, under the Aggregate Resources Act.

The application relates to parcels of land in both the Town of Milton and the Town of Halton Hills and total approximately 82.5 hectare in size, located generally in the southwest corner of the Town of Halton Hills. The proposal comprises some 47.17 hectares of land in the Town of Halton Hills, 39.53 hectares of which is proposed for quarrying and extraction purposes. The properties are located near 10479 Esquesing-Nassagaweya Town Line, west of Regional Road 25, south of 15 Side Road, Concession 1, Parts of Lots 13 & 14, Halton Hills. The properties are mainly vacant, and located within a predominantly rural area, above the brow of the Niagara Escarpment.

General Committee for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss the proposed amendment to the Town of Halton Hills Official Plan. The proposed Official Plan Amendment would have the effect of amending the Township of Esquesing Official Plan, and further lifting the deferral in the Town of Halton Hills Official Plan, by modifying the Official Plan designation to "Mineral Resource Extraction Area".




