Boxer's minor mistake proves costly at tourney

A split-second letdown proved painful for Matt Hart Jr. Friday night.

During light heavyweight competition at the Ray McGibbon's Gloves Tournament in St. Catharines, Milton's 24-year-old boxer dropped his guard for about the time it takes most people to blink.

However, that afforded Brampton's Alex Ward a sufficient window of opportunity to step in and connect with a thunderous straight-away right to the nose.

The third-round blow didn't floor the local pugilist, but did daze him enough for the referee to deliver a standing eight count and --- upon further consideration — stop the fight.

Subsequently, Hart Jr. was denied entry to the gold-medal round of the weekend showcase --which represented his first bout in several months, due to an eye injury plus a no-show and a tournament cancellation.

"I felt okay, but I guess I didn't respond as well as he (referee) considered suitable to continue," explained Hart Jr. "That's the way it goes in boxing sometimes."

Not that he's laying blame on the official. Even without the third-round stoppage Friday, Hart Jr. admits he wasn't performing up to his capabilities.

"The fight was pretty even through the first two rounds but I was getting a little frustrated there and not connecting on some of my combinations, which is unusual for me. I normally have a pretty high punch count. Overall, I was kind of disappointed with my performance."

Matt Jr. had hoped to slip into the middleweight

class, but was a couple of pounds too heavy during Friday afternoon's weigh-in — which perhaps set a bad omen for the rest of the tournament.

The loss left him with the bronze medal, while Ward went on to capture the gold.

Nevertheless, the Hamilton Regency Boxing Club member hopes to learn from this weekend's setback and put up a better fight in his next appearance, which could come as early as mid-May in Hamilton.

"There's a tournament tentatively scheduled, but things often get canceled. That's the nature of amateur boxing," said Hart.
