Gary Ferrier found himself amid familiar surroundings last weekend at the Canada-East Wrestling Championships in Ste. Cesaire, Quebec.

The Milton Dynamo ace once again stood atop the podium when it was all said and done — sporting his fourth consecutive gold medal.

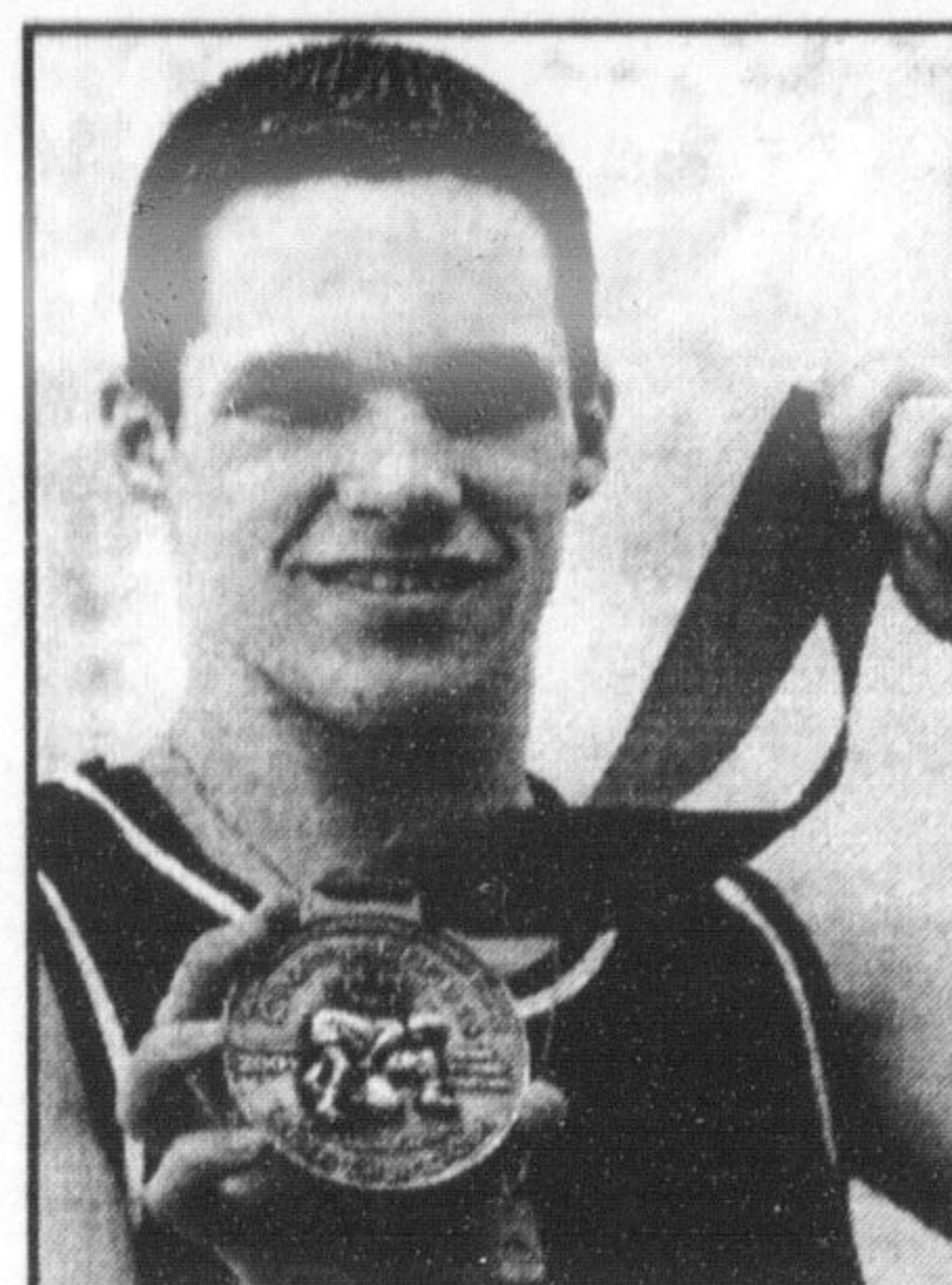
This time around he prevailed in the 55-kilogram bantam division — and as usual, his title run was paved in dominating fashion.

The 13-year-old grappler, who ends his kids-bantam career with an unblemished record, delivered pinfall victories over Quebec's Alexandre Scott and Manitoulin Island's Jeff Ray to reach the finals.

Then he rallied from a shaky start to topple Newfoundland's Adam Norman 12-2 for the gold.

Joining Ferrier in the championship circle was first-time winner Nick Ronan.

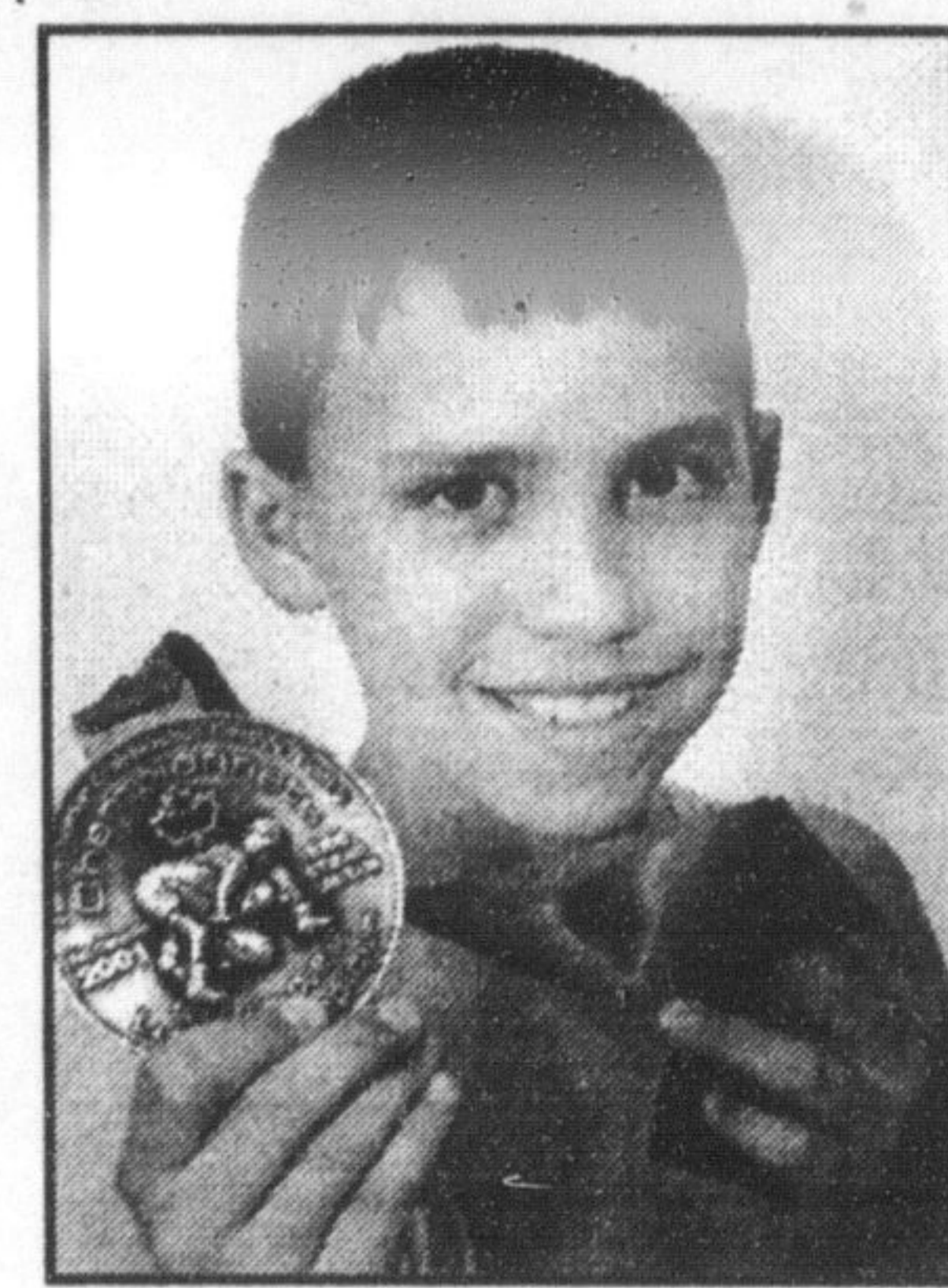
The 12-year-old cruised to victory in the 43 kg. kids class with three consecutive pins and a 5-4 decision over Mariposa's Blake House, in what was arguably the most exhilarating finals bout of the day.

Milton's contingent also came away with three bronze medals in Quebec.

Carl Chan took third-place honours in Ferrier's division, losing a second-round match to the eventual silver medalist. He rebounded with two pinfall wins, including one in comeback

Meanwhile, Anthony Perruzza was the other bronze-medal winner in the 75 kg. division.

He captured his medal with a pinning triumph over London's Kyle Crockwright.

Also competing for Milton at the Canada-East showcase were Shea Deli and Nick

Vipond — who finished fourth and sixth respectively with identical 2-2 records to round out one of the best Canada-East performances ever by the Dynamos.

While the Dynamos season is now over, E.C. Drury High graduate John McCart — who took bronze at OFSAA in 2000 — headed to Vancouver earlier this week to participate in the National Junior World Trials.

Jr. Royals' shutout string finally over

The shutout string is over, but the unbeaten run remains.

Bishop Reding's junior boys soccer squad was scored on for the first time in nine games at home against St. Thomas Aquinas Tuesday.

But the defending league champs refused to accept defeat, rallying from the early deficit to tie the Raiders 1-1 and extend their undefeated streak to 11 games.

Jason Ferria delivered the equalizer, burying a redirect header off a free kick from fellow veteran Dave Wynne.

The draw kept BR (2-0-1) stationed atop Halton Region's Volpe Division, with St. Thomas and Loyola close behind.

"It's hard to say just who'll make it to the finals," said co-coach Gord McCarles. "St. Thomas, Loyola and us are all pretty evenly matched. We're three talented teams."

Ferria and Wynne — who alongside rookie Mike Adcock share the season scor-

ing lead, with three goals apiece — provided standout efforts up front, while solid in the backfield were freshman sweeper Robbie Wilson and Lance Morin.

The Royals looked to push their unbeaten record to a dozen games yesterday afternoon at Milton District. Results were not available at press time.

Meanwhile, Reding's senior squad went into yesterday's cross-town clash in desperate need of a win — after getting white-washed by St. Thomas 2-0 Tuesday.

This marked their second straight loss and further hindered their bid to gain home-field advantage for the opening round of the playoffs.

"About 75 per cent of the afternoon we were on our game. We broke down for about 15 minutes and they capitalized," remarked McCarles, who coaches both teams alongside Fernando Costa.

BR's seniors — 1-2 heading into battle against the Mustangs — gave up both goals in the second half, one on a penalty shot and the other on a rather fluky scramble. Earlier on they had a number of quality scoring chances, but enjoyed no finish.

Kyle Grant and Onel Martino created the lion's share of opportunities for the Royals.

If unsuccessful against MD yesterday, the senior Royals would have to split next week just to earn a playoff spot and would probably need to take both games in order to play hosts in the first round.

"We've got to win," stressed McCarles. "We've got to come mentally prepared."

This weekend the seniors compete in the All-Ontario Catholic Tournament in Hamilton, where they took fourth last year.
