

Fearsome four make big waves

Milton's golden girls sank their provincial competition last weekend in Etobicoke.

The fearsome foursome delivered one of the club's most impressive efforts in recent memory during the Ontario Division III Team Swim Championships — collectively capturing 16 gold medals.

Leading the way at the short course season-ending meet with five first-place performances were 12-year-old Aaryn Fraser and 15-year-old Jennifer Porenta.

Fraser upstaged her opposition in a variety of events — using both speed and endurance to triumph in the 100 metre freestyle, 200m breaststroke, 200m butterfly, 400m freestyle and 400m individual medley.

The bulk of Porenta's success lay in freestyle competition, where she turned back all challengers over 50, 100 and 200m distances. She was also golden in the 100m butterfly and 200m individual medley.

Close behind with four gold-medal swims was inspirational leader Kristen McIlroy. The 14-year-old won the 100m freestyle, 100 and 200m backstroke and the 400m individual medley. She also struck silver in the 200m freestyle.

Rounding out the gold-medal march with victories in the 100 and 200m breaststroke was 17-year-old Kate Chapman.

Together, the four girls collected 160 points and guided the Marlins to a fourth-place showing, their best in club history.

Milton garnered seven other medals during the weekend, including three bronzes for nine-year-old David Dimitrov. Older brother George secured two bronze medals while Rachel Robinson and Jacqueline Clarke took home a silver and bronze respectively.




