Town gearing up to compete in Communities in Bloom contest

For the third year in a row, Milton will take part in the Communities in Bloom competition.

The town will compete against other Ontario communities in the population category of 20,001 to 50,000.

"We've never achieved national status," said Joy Anderson, coordinator of community development. "You start at the provincial level, then can move to national and then international. This year we're aiming for national."

The eight general areas of judging consideration include

tidiness, urban forestry, landscaped areas, floral displays, turf areas, environmental effort, heritage conservation and community involvement.

"The Communities in Bloom competition is a chance to show what makes the community a great place to live in," Ms Anderson said. "That's what the program is really about. It's not just about flowers."

Two judges will have the opportunity to tour the town August 16 with members of the town's Communities in Bloom Committee.

The community winners will be announced in September. "They'll (judges) see the whole municipality, both rural and urban Milton," she said. "It'll be a community designed tour. We're in the process of designing the tour route. It's important that the judges meet with as many people from the town as possible, including the mayor and council members."

to the final destination in Markham.


A kick-off party will be held Friday night at the Hardball on Regional Road 25 with radio host 97.7. Pledge forms are available there.
