Retirees and dedicated teachers of the Halton Catholic District School Board will be honoured during 'A Celebration of Staff' Friday.


Among the honoured guests will be 10 Milton teachers.

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING PROPOSED OFFICIAL PLAN AND ZONING **BY-LAW AMENDMENTS** - RESIDENTIAL CARE FACILITIES

Council for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss proposed amendments to the Official Plan and Zoning by-laws of the Town with regard to residential care facilities. Residential care facilities are defined as residential facilities in which residents who have a range of emotional, psychiatric, physical, developmental, or social disadvantages or problems live in a 24-hour supervised setting, and receive both room and board and support with daily living. Residential care facilities include group homes.

The purpose of the proposed Official Plan and Zoning by-law amendments is to establish planning policies and regulations that will continue to permit residential care facilities, while ensuring that they are registered and appropriately located and distributed within the Town of Halton Hills. The amendments to the Official Plan and Zoning by-laws will apply to the Town of Halton Hills as a whole.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the proposed Official Plan and Zoning by-law amendments does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Official Plan and Zoning by-law amendments are adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.


Copies of the Final Report of the Halton Hills Residential Care Facilities Study, including the proposed Official Plan and Zoning by-law amendments will be available for public review and comment from May 23, 2001 in the Town of Halton Hills Planning Department.


