
There aren't a lot of people who wouldn't be happy about spending three months in Arizona, except maybe Pat Lynch.

Mind you, it's not the weather he's complaining about, but the length of time he's spent rehabilitating his arm at the Rockies' baseball complex. "I only anticipated being here a month, but all these little setbacks. I can't wait to get out of here and on to my first start."

Lynch gets his wish tomorrow as he leaves for Tri-Cities, Washington, the Rockies farm team in short season A classification. He is still rehabilitating, but hopes to finally get a start within a couple of weeks and then move up in the organization depending on his progress.

Lynch says he has pitched well in workouts, but that the arm has acted up on him at times. It's nothing out of the ordinary, just part of the process after the surgery he had.

He knows that others have to go through the same deal, but that isn't making him feel any better.

Even worse, said Lynch, is that he had never had a problem before with his arm, from playing rep ball in Milton right through high school.

"It's amazingly frustrating, up and down all the time. It seems like it's never going to end.

"So much hard work and it feels as if it hasn't paid off. That's really the frustrating part."

It may be tough to deal with for Lynch,

but on the positive side, the Rockies organization is taking every precaution in dealing with his rehabilitation, which in the long term will be the best thing for him.

In the short term, trading sunny Arizona for rainy Washington will suit him just fine.


