# Stellar pitching and defense leads to wins for midget Sox

Milton's midget baseball team was perfect in the field and nearly equaled that on the mound en route to whitewashing Woodstock 2-0 Monday night at Maplehurst Ball Park.

The Red Sox gave up just two hits and delivered their first error-free contest during the highly entertaining victory — which pushed their regular season record to 10-3.

Steve Spiers struck out 15 batters over eight innings while fanning a pair in the final frame was Paul Duff. Each allowed just a single hit and enjoyed sharp defense the entire evening.

Both runs were cashed in during third-inning play, on a two-strike single to right field by Kevin Cooper. Scoring were Andrew Pepper and Evan Jeans — both of whom advanced on a sacrifice fly by Chris Dumencu.

The previous afternoon at Brian Best Park, Milton highlighted its season by no-hitting Martingrove and winning 5-1.

Dumencu did the lion's share of pitching — holding visiting batters at bay for seven-and-a-third innings — while Cooper came in to put things away.

A walk and infield error led to the lone run against Milton.

Jeans threw out four runners attempting to steal second and another at third to lead a rock-solid fielding campaign.

The Red Sox' broke a scoreless stalemate with two runs in the seventh and then strengthened their hold down the stretch. Milton had 10 hits overall — three of which were recorded by Conan O'Brien, who drove in Andrew Kirkland for the winning run.

The back-to-back victories extended the midgets' winning streak to three games. They begin a two-game road trip in Burlington Monday.

#### Mavericks whitewash Whitby

Milton's intermediate lacrosse team returned to its winning ways in fierce fashion at John Tonelli Sports Centre Monday.
