Safe food sessions held at local store

To combat the increased risk of food-borne illness, the Halton Region Health Department will host information sessions, dubbed FightBAC, at local food retailers. Sessions will cover safe food handling, preparation and storage practices.

Wednesday and Thursday.

The health department recommends cleaning your hands, utensils and cooking surfaces with soap and water before, during and after preparing food. Countertops, cutting boards and utensils should also be washed with a mild bleach and water solution. Also remember to keep raw foods separate during storage.
