Officer foils store break-in

Sometimes you just have to be in the right place at the right time.

That's something Det. Const. Brad Cook can relate to.

On his way home from work shortly after midnight July 18, he noticed a "suspicious" van parked outside Halton Grounds Care Equipment on Steeles Avenue.

He followed the van, which eventually stopped at the Tim Horton's at Steeles Avenue and

Thompson Road.

After speaking with the men inside the van, Det. Const. Cook went back to his car. At that time, the four men fled the van and scattered in all directions.

"Halton Grounds Care has been broken into before, so I knew to keep an eye on that area," Det. Const. Cook said.

"You pull over suspicious vehicles all the time. My first impression is it's a janitor but you have to be sure. This time it wasn't."

As soon as the men fled, he

called his fellow officers and an immediate search was launched.

An hour later, one of the suspects was arrested inside the Tim Horton's.

A 21-year-old Toronto man was charged with break and enter, possession of stolen property and fail to comply with probation.

The remaining three suspects have yet to be arrested.

Police recovered equipment from the van valued at more than \$10,000, including three riding lawn mowers and a snow blower.


