"The whole point of the exchange is to improve their language skills," said Lindsay Bernard, Halton Summer Works — Student Exchange coordinator. "As long as they have some kind of a base, at least grade 9 French, they'll be fine.

"We kind of send them away and hope they'll be okay," she laughed.

While on their respective exchanges, students immerse themselves in the community by working for non-profit organizations. While in the Milton area, Chantal Quirion, 17, (staying with the Brighton family) is working at the Allendale long-term-care facility and Christine Robillard, 16, (staying with the Stokes family) is working at Crawford Lake Conservation Area.

"It's fun there," said Ms Robillard. "I give tours of the longhouses. I do it in English and in French because some people come from France and Quebec to visit."

Both exchange students told The Champion their main reason for joining the

exchange was to cross the language barrier.

It was a matter of preparing for the future, Ms R o b i 1 l a r d explained. "I know that for my future jobs I need English. I think English is a good language to know because everybody speaks English."



tour Ontario and see the sights with others on exchange throughout Halton. The group has already been to Niagara Falls, downtown Toronto, and rented small water crafts.

"We work 35 hours a week and on weekends we travel. It has been a good time."

In addition to the obvious language lessons, the exchange program provides students with opportunities they may otherwise not have had, said Ms Bernard.

"A lot of them really haven't had a job yet and this way they don't have to go through all of the interview process — we set them up with the job," she said.

"And for a lot of them it's their first time

away from home, so they come back with a little more maturity and a little more travelled. It's kind of a new experience in every aspect for them."

Ms Stokes and Ms Brighton were unavailable for comment on their experience with the program, but both Quebec students agreed it's an experience they would recommend.






