# Milton baseball standouts are HAC-ing around this summer

Two Milton baseball standouts will be HACing around local diamonds this month.

Hallan King and Liam Tennant will face competition from both sides of the border during back-to-back tournaments within the region as part of the Halton Athletic Club (HAC) Under-18 squad.

They'll begin their local stretch this weekend at the Ninth Line Diamonds in Oakville for the Halton Wood Bat tournament. Then from August 10 to 12, HAC will play host to the Franklin Cup at Burlington's Millcroft

Franklin Sports will sponsor the latter event and use it to introduce its new pro wood bat at the amateur level. Among the teams competing will be the Ontario Select 17's.

At 14 and 15 years of age respectively, Tennant and King will be squaring off top-level players much older than them and these upcoming tournament provide an ideal opportunity to see these gifted locals in action.






