CBS lab technicians have hit picket lines

*Milton shouldn't feel
 a significant impact
 in the labour dispute*

Workers who supply Milton District Hospital with blood and blood supplies went on strike Wednesday, disrupting service to hospitals throughout the Golden Horseshoe.

A tentative agreement was reached between Canadian Blood Services and union negotiators Tuesday, but it was rejected by workers Wednesday.

The workers — members of the Ontario Public Service Employees Union Local 210 — hit the picket lines at 11 p.m. that night.

No further negotiations were scheduled as of press time.

According to Sid Stacey, vice-president of programs for Milton District and Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial hospitals, Milton shouldn't feel a "significant" impact from the strike.

He has told The Champion that additional supplies had been received and back-up supplier were contacted.
