Jacqueline Smith Highland Dance Studio Winning by leaps and bounds

The energetic dancers at this studio are celebrating their accomplishments at the recent Provincial and Canadian Highland Dance championships this summer. Two students competed successfully with over 120 dancers at the Provincial Championships at Toronto's harbourfront on the first weekend of June. Chantal Watt took home her fifth consecutive gold win for Overall Provincial Champion in the 15 and under category. "Chantal was delighted to defend her title successfully," said studio owner Jacqueline Smith. "It was quite an accomplishment and it set a standard for the whole summer as the students continued to train for the Canadian

Championships." Sarah Dewolfe, a runner-up at this competition two years ago, won first place in all four dances for the 17 and under category, winning Special Dancer of the Day by accumulating the most points.

Both girls competed at the Canadian Championships in July where Chantal won gold, again for the fifth time and Sarah, recovering from a sprained ankle at a competition in Ohio two weeks earlier, won third place. With these wins under their belts (or should we say "under their sashes?") these two competitors are gearing up for the World Championships in Scotland at the end of August. "I am hoping they will continue to do their best and reach their goals, which they definitely have been doing," says Jacqueline.

The Jacqueline Smith Highland Dance Studio opened in Milton in 1998

and now includes dancers ranging from 4 years of age to adults. Jacqueline Smith, studio owner and instructor, is herself a four-time World Highland Dance Champion, being the first North American to win all three divisions. As an instructor, she has 12 years of experience and has been invited to teach workshops across Canada and the United States. She is also a Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing Judge.
