Young boy recognized for alerting his family to fire

Scott Dumencu is one brave nine-year-old boy.

After dozing off shortly after midnight May 28, Scott woke up around 2 a.m. to see smoke travelling through an open window of his Derry Road home. Moments later, the smoke detector went off.

"At first I thought someone was cooking," he said. "We always leave the window open and the fan on. When I saw the curtain flashing (flames) I knew I had to get my parents and brothers."

So he dashed to his parents' room and woke them up. Then they woke the other two boys and headed for safety outside.

"I watched TV and they told you what to do (in case of a fire)," Scott said. "I was thinking if I should get my brothers up first or my parents. I got my parents up first because I thought they would know what to

Asked if he thought of leaving the house without alerting his parents or brothers, he shook his head.

"I didn't want to get out. I've thought about fires and what I would do (in the situation) and I thought I would get my parents out."

The fire travelled to the attic,

causing \$75,000 damage.

Because of his bravery, the Milton Professional Fire Fighters Association presented Scott with a Recognition Award Wednesday night at Central Station on Steeles Avenue in front of 20 friends and family members.

Scott said he was "very shocked" to be recognized.

"We can't stress enough the recognition." importance of having working smoke alarms on every floor (of the home)," said Milton Fire Captain Mark Cross, who presented the award to Scott.




