Only 10 Merchant forwards had been signed on for regular duty at press time yesterday, although general manager Nick Slawson wasn't overly concerned with that — stating that a strong affiliation with the Toronto Young Nats organization should help the club get over its initial hump, which includes six games in 10 days.
