Plenty of exciting action at soccer's championship day

Convincing wins and slim victories were in equal supply at Saturday's Milton Youth Soccer championship day.

Delivering the most explosive performance of the day was the youngest champs of the bunch. Among under-11 boys, the Lindsay McLaren-ReMax sponsored team amassed 18 goals in three games — including a whopping 10 in a quarterfinal shutout over Milton Heights Academy.

The eventual victors went on to double up Zak's Pharmacy 4-2 in the semifinals and clinched the title with a 4-1 ousting of Maksteel — who had reached the finals with slim decisions over Knuckles Sportshop (3-2) and Brian's Auto Repair and Tire (3-1).

Goals didn't come with nearly as much frequency in girls under-11 action. Vanler Insurance reigned supreme after outdistancing Microlink 2-1 in the semifinals and blanking Milton Dodge Jeep 1-0 in the championship showdown.

Project Automation's under-11 girls division victory was quite decisive. Their 3-0 title-clinching win over Kodiak Power Equipment followed a 6-2 semifinal downing of Kat and Nat.

Like Project Automation, Kodiak Power Equipment earned a quarterfinal bye and then edged Nassagaweya 1-0 to reach the championship.

In under-16 girls play, Milton IDA whitewashed the Milton Jaycees 3-0 to take the title. This followed a 2-0 semifinal shutout over Petro Canada.

Taking this age class championship for the boys side was New Automation, who began the day by defeating PlacerDom in the semifinals and putting the finishing touches on their title run by blanking Bi-Line Systems 3-0.

Loblaws won the boys under-13 title, although scores from this division were not available at press time yesterday.
