Merchants edge feisty Lightning

The Merchants' first road trip of the season was both surprising and successful.

On the way to Buffalo Monday, Milton enjoyed a rather quick border crossing — which was certainly unexpected in light of beefed up security spawn from last week's terrorist attacks — and then capped the night by outlasting the feisty Lightning 4-3.

Dan Bognar scored two powerplay goals down the stretch, including the game winner on a short-range rebound early in the third period. From there, he helped plug the gap on defense left by veteran Chris Krieg — who went down with a torn MCL during a nasty knee-on-knee collision in the opening frame.

"Dan was every bit as good on the blueline as he was up front. He was really invaluable," said general manager Nick Slawson. "Overall I think we were a little more prepared (than for the home opener Friday). We gave a reasonably complete-game effort."

For the second straight game, the defending West Conference champions' victory was fueled by a 3-for-7 powerplay.

In addition to the two markers by Bognar, David Ovcjak scored with the man-advantage to continue building on a solid exhibition campaign.

Former Georgetown Raider Brandon Valente netted his new team's only even-strength goal early in middle stanza. Michel Bond assisted on the first and final deposits.

Trevor Battaglia turned back nearly two dozen shots for the win.

Defenceman Matt Bartlett missed Monday's game while his Jr. A rights were being disputed by the Trenton Sting. Slawson expected the matter to be resolved by tonight - when the Merchants begin a threegames-in-as-many-days stretch at home against Brampton.

Tomorrow they're in Georgetown for a 7:30 p.m. start while Sunday at 9:30 a.m. they do battle with Markham in College Weekend play at Mississauga's Iceland Arena.
