

The Merchants had to look outside their division for victory this past weekend.

During College Weekend play at Mississauga's Iceland Arena Sunday, Milton salvaged a rather uninspired three-games-in-as-many-days stretch by rallying to eclipse the Northern Conference Markham Waxers.

This followed a pair of two-goal defeats to the West's Brampton Capitals and Georgetown Raiders.

Brampton 3, Milton 1

Trevor Battaglia delivered a second straight stellar performance on home ice, although his crafty cage work wasn't supported by much in the way of either intensity or structured play.

Milton managed to stay fairly composed during a few minor skirmishes, but was physically dominated and offensively punchless for much of the night Friday.

David Ovcjak's shorthanded goal late in the second period offered a glimmer of comeback hope, although one measly shot on eight minutes of powerplay time in the final frame certainly squashed that.

The Danny Gould-less Capitals still appear to be quite sturdy and won most of the close-quarter encounters. Veterans Jeff Hristovski, Kenny Sousa and David Thompson did the scoring while turning in dynamite goaltending was newcomer Tristan Dassy.

The Merchants were caught in their own end through much of periods one and two — due in large part to poor breakout attempts and careless passes in the neutral zone.

The game-winner marker — his first of the year and certainly the most dramatic one so far for the club — highlighted a late surge for the offensively disjointed Merchants.

Milton scored three times in both the first and final frames but was rather punchless for rest of the morning clash at Iceland Sunday.

Arruda delivered the team's second hat-trick of the year — joining rookie Rich Meloche in that department — while Harshaw cemented the win with a last-minute empty netter. Meloche also lit the lamp while Harshaw and Bognar each had three assists.


Battaglia was between the pipes and stopped about three dozen shots for his third win as a Merchant. Milton coughed up a three-goal cushion before rallying to win.
