Milton Rev. John Roberts national received attention September 10 when the federal government presented him with a volunteerism award on CTV's Canada AM.

"He was extremely well-liked by the officers in Peggy's Cove," said Const. Mike Cote of the RCMP. "He's a jovial fellow, a gentleman that makes you feel comfortable. We certainly consider ourselves lucky to have him on board as part of our organization."

The award presentation was made in conjunction with the International Year of the Volunteer, as declared by the United Nations.
