New Town program aimed at improving youths' self-esteem

A new program at the Milton Seniors' Activity Centre (MSAC) looks to boost youth self-esteem — without them realizing it.

"It's based more on having fun than lecturing. It's mostly through games, activities and crafts that we're trying to aid in the development of self-esteem," said Tammy Corless, MSAC recreation supervisor.

In fact, Ms Corless hopes the youths have so much fun they don't notice the educational value of the program.

"Kids don't want to sit and listen to someone preach to them. The more interactive it is, the more we feel that children are going to learn from it."

Open to youngsters in grades 5 to 9, the 'Proud To Be Me' program will be held Monday evenings between October 15 and December 3.

"It's a very hard age to go through with all the changes to their bodies," Ms Corless said. "We're trying to help them develop some social skills as well to try to help

them get over their fears."

Each week, the program will focus on a different theme — running the gamut from communication, stress management, anger and body image, to home life and decision making.

The need for a program of this nature became obvious to Ms Corless through her work in organizing the Friday Evening Youth Program among other youth-oriented programs.

Being actively involved with Milton youth, she said she has noticed an increasing difficulty for youth in friendship development and other self-esteem related difficulties.

"And I've heard a lot of things like, 'I wish my child would stick up for themselves' from parents," Ms Corless continued. "There seems to be a real need for these types of programs."

The cost of the program is \$60 per person.
