Smoke Alarms Save Lives

Early warning about a fire means you have a better chance to escape before it spreads. Install at least one smoke alarm on every floor. Hallways longer than 30 feet should have one at each end. Smoke alarms should be placed near sleeping areas either on the ceiling (at least 6 to 12 inches from the wall) or on the wall (6 to 12 inches down from the ceiling).

Because many homes have bedrooms located on a second floor, an emergency escape ladder is invaluable if the normal exit route down the stairs is blocked by flames, heat or smoke.

Choose a compact, lightweight, tangle-free ladder that grips widow frames of variable widths, for maximum flexibility.






