Milton's AA midgets probably won't be the nightly pushover they were last season.

But that doesn't mean they're above giving the occasional impression of one. And Monday on home ice the local lads offered a dandy — getting hammered by the first entry Brampton Battalion 9-4.

The Milton Toyota Winterhawks delivered some intense play early on but faltered through periods two and three en route to their widest margin of defeat this year — and third loss at Memorial Arena.

A couple of goals in the dying moments made the final score a little more respectable, but that's about the only consolation the hosts would skate away with from a thoroughly uninspired performance.

Well, that and a solid powerplay campaign — which accounted for three of the four goals. Scoring with the manadvantage were Chris Coates, Scott McLaughlin and Paul Szafer.

The Winterhawks' only even-strength tally came with a minute remaining on a short-range blast by Chris Cito.

First-period action offered hope for an entertaining and competitive clash, as the two sides gave those in attendance an impressive mix of close-quarter battles and open-ice play. But Brampton sank three goals within a two-minute span early in the second, and this concentrated scoring burst served as a back-breaker for the Winterhawks.

Milton got one back before the visitors flexed their scoring muscles again with five straight deposits.

Goaltender Jason Strong was solid through the early going — especially when challenged downstairs — but eventually succumbed to an overpowering attack that was left uncontested far too often.

Shots on net favoured Brampton 39-23 Monday. Derek Blanchard missed the festivities with a one-game suspension.

Two days earlier at Memorial, Milton brushed aside the traditionally inferior Georgetown Raiders 6-0. Kyle Goertz' flawless cage work and a balanced scoring effort highlighted the weekend mismatch.

Daryl Tielemans tallied twice while singles went to Blanchard, Erick Lizon, Julian Ricci and Adam Rutz.

The Winterhawks outchanced their regional rivals nearly two-to-one and were never seriously challenged.

Now sporting a record of 6-3, Milton's midgets are on pace to be one of the most improved local rep teams this season. They'll continue working toward that end tomorrow night in Owen Sound.

Ruling over Battaglia goes in Jr. A Merchants' favour


The Merchants' fortunes have taken a turn for the better — off the ice as well as on it.


