

Thieves successful in one out of two rural break-ins

One No. 3 Sideroad home was broken into, but thieves were scared away from another, Saturday.

Suspects gained access through an unlocked side door and made off with \$600 in one home sometime between 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

In the other incident, two males were scared away as they attempted to pry open a window and door.

The suspects ran from the scene when the residents appeared.

No suspects have been arrested in the incident.

Police seek suspects in fire

Halton Regional Police are investigating a deliberately-set fire that occurred at Sam Sherratt School September 2.

The fire was lit in a garbage bin and was extinguished by the Milton Fire Department.

Although accelerant wasn't discovered, the fire was likely intentionally set by one or more of a group of five teenagers seen in the

area at the time. Police were able to get descriptions of two suspects.

The first suspect is a white male, 16 to 17 years of age with blond hair. He was five-foot-nine, 170 pounds, wearing a blue windbreak-

er and dark-coloured pants. He was seen riding a dark-coloured child's bike with a bell on it.

The second suspect is a white male, 16 to 17 years of age, six feet and 170 pounds. He was wearing light gray knee-length shorts, a brownish-orange checkered jacket and a beige baseball cap.

House fire being probed

A fire that destroyed a No. 15 Sideroad home Monday is being investigated by the Ontario Fire Marshal's office.

The Milton Fire Department was called to 4189 No. 15 Sideroad at about 10:30 p.m. and found a wood-framed house fully engulfed in flames.

Firefighters battled the fire for an hour and stayed on the property overnight putting out patches of fire and smoke.

The house was being renovated and no one was living in it, said Captain Mark Cross of the fire department.

The house was valued at \$130,000.


