The Merchants' fortunes gradually improved as last week wore

Carriere made an immediate impact with his new club during battle with neighbouring Georgetown Friday. Taking a back pass in the slot from rookie linemate Dan Carcillo, he beat Raider goalie Zak Brown down low midway through the third period for the potential game winner.

Georgetown spoiled the victory party, however, inside the final minute of regulation when Ryan Robert connected on a huge rebound — the second with a rock-solid Sean Samuel out of position — to tie Milton 2-2.

The Merchants had half-a-dozen scoring chances in overtime but failed to break the stalemate.

North Halton's Jr. A clubs exchanged goals in the second period as well. Defenceman Shawn Mole lit the lamp for the home side while scoring for the visitors was T.J. Trevelyan.

Milton staved off defeat Friday — for the first time in three games — but not the injury bug. Interim captain David Ovcjak went down with a leg injury late in the first period and will likely be sidelined for the rest of November.

Closing out the week in Burlington Sunday, Milton nearly coughed up a four-goal cushion but managed to shade the Cougars 5-4 and leapfrog past Streetsville into seventh spot in the Western
