



Big Sisters, Brothers groups still separate

National amalgamation doesn't involve local Halton organizations

Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Canada joined forces last week, but there'll be no amalgamation locally.

The Big Brothers Association of Halton - which services Milton - and the Big Sisters Association of North Halton will remain separate entities, said Claudia Scobie, executive director of the latter organization.

"To service north Halton, it's of no value for us to join," Ms Scobie explained.

"We have our own issues here in north Halton, in terms of transportation and so forth."

Cooperation will increase


Even though there won't be a local amalgamation, the combining of the national agencies will likely lead to increased cooperation on a local level, said Evelyn Rea, executive director for Big Brothers of Halton.

"We try to work with both the agencies as best we can. And I think down the road we'll look at feasibility, service and programs and talk about how we see ourselves strategically in the next three or four years," she said.
