Milton isn't doing enough on fire safety: fire marshal

Milton isn't up to code when it comes to fire prevention education, says the Ontario Fire Marshal's Office.

Marshal's Office recently conducted a Municipal Fire Protection Information Survey of Milton — an initiative it's doing in municipalities across the province — and found Milton needs a more effective smoke alarm program.

"Based on our analysis of information gathered to date, your municipality is not currently providing the minimum required services in fire prevention and public education in accordance with the community needs as prescribed in the FPPA (Fire Protection and Prevention Act)," reads a letter to Mayor Gord Krantz from the Fire Marshal's Office.

But new firefighters set to start

next month will go a long way toward bringing Milton into compliance, Fire Chief Harold Penson told the Town's community services committee November 26.

"Council knows we're hiring on some more people very shortly, in December, and these people will assist in this effective smoke alarm program, inspection of homes (when there's concern) and the handing out of information to the public," he said.

"We are working towards bringing our fire prevention issues up to standard."

With the addition of five firefighters, Mr. Penson said he hopes to have a more effective smoke alarm program up and running by March.

"A smoke alarm program will address the problems we're having right now," he continued. "We are finding now that people have smoke alarms, but there's no batteries in them. So this (home inspections) is something we're going to have to get into."

When the fire department is called to a location and finds there are no smoke detectors or no working batteries in the detectors, a detector and/or batteries are provided on loan. The materials are to be returned to the fire department once appropriate replacements have been purchased and installed by the property owner.

Short-comings derived from the survey must be kept in perspective, Town CAO Mario Belvedere told the committee. "These are new regulations and Milton is one of the first eight communities surveyed. I would imagine we're not alone in

Town staff were instructed by the committee to work with the Milton Fire Department to bring the town into compliance with the standards of the FPPA.

Bureau fund needs big boost

To date, \$3,269 has been collected for the campaign — which ensures that all local families have


