Council gives green light to crematorium

Facility to be built at Evergreen Cemetery

Milton council gave the green light Monday to Evergreen Cemetery for the creation of a crematorium.

Following approval of a site plan, the current works garage at the rear of the Ontario Street property will be converted into a crematorium.

A new works garage is to be built behind the current building.

Jim Dills, a member of the Evergreen Cemetery board and chairman of the crematorium committee, previously told The Champion the move is designed to meet a growing demand.

"Trends in the grieving industry are definitely increasing in the cremation area. More and more — I think around 40 per cent — deaths involve cremation. There is a community need."

Because of the rigors of site plan development and approval, Mr. Dills said there isn't a construction timeline.

Town to replace mailboxes damaged by its snow plows

Owners of mailboxes damaged by Town snow plows this winter are eligible for up to \$100 for repairs/replacement.

Town council agreed Monday to offer the compensation and relax the requirements to qualify for the funds after a staff recommendation to do so was presented at

the November 26 Milton community services committee meeting.

The committee recommendation to council called for up to \$50 compensation, but Councillor John Challinor suggested that was too little.

"I think \$100 is more appropriate."

An additional 15 km of sidewalks in school routes and major pedestrian traffic


