

Drugs seized after van stopped on Steeles Ave.

One Hamilton man faces a drug charge while another faces two counts of stolen property following an incident on Steeles Avenue Tuesday.

At 2:45 p.m. police stopped a 1987 Astrovan with licence plates and a validation tag that were reported stolen. Upon investigation, a small quantity of marijuana was found.

A 33-year-old man was charged with possession of a controlled substance while a 26-year-old man was arrested on two counts of stolen property.

Assault at Hilton Falls

A 53-year-old Toronto man has been charged in connection with an altercation at Hilton Falls Sunday.

According to police, a Mississauga couple was hiking at the local conservation site at about 1:30 p.m. when they came upon a man with two barking dogs.

A heated argument regarding the canines ensued, at which point the Mississauga man was punched in the mouth. He sustained a rather deep cut and required several stitches.

A man was arrested a short time later and

Local business targeted

Computer equipment and a digital camera were stolen when unknown culprits broke into Hands Fireworks on Industrial Drive overnight Sunday.

The suspects initially tried to pry open the front door but then gained access by smashing a window.

The stolen property is valued at \$3,000.

Prescription drugs swiped

A quantity of Dilaudid — a Morphine-like pain killer — was stolen during a break-in at Zak's Pharmacy on Main Street Saturday morning.

Unknown suspects smashed the side glass door to gain access before removing the drug.

Damage during the early morning break-in was estimated at \$500.

Tim Hortons outlet broken into Dec. 24

Halton Regional Police in Milton are investigating a break-in at Tim Hortons on Steeles Avenue Christmas Eve.

The suspects entered the shop via the metal security door and pruned the doors with a blunt tool.

The culprits then ransacked the rear office, removing the video recorder and prying open an empty storage closet. No cash or goods were stolen during the entry.

A similar break-in occurred

Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) Improvements Class Environmental Assessment Study

The Regional Municipality of Halton has initiated a Class Environmental Assessment to consider options to satisfy travel demand on Trafalgar Road from Britannia Road north to the south ramp of Highway 401 (see map below). To address operational deficiencies associated with this segment of Trafalgar Road, a number of road improvement alternatives will be examined as part of the study including widening of the roadway, new road alignments, possible railway crossing and improvements to intersections, among others.

In accordance with Schedule C of the Municipal Engineers Association *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* (June 2000), this Notice signals the second Public Information Centre (PIC) to provide further information to the public and interested stakeholders and to receive input and feedback on the study to date.
