'Hawks battle back from two series deficits to dispose of the Raiders



Adam Smith ran roughshod over his 66.5 kg. cadet class opposition with three convincing victories to capture gold. After an opening-round bye, he secured back-toback pin-falls to reach the final - where he scored early and often to blank Sudbury's John Berry 10-0.

Matt Knock followed up on last year's cadet championship win with a silvermedal performance during his debut as a juvenile. Following consecutive pin-fall wins, the 58 kg. wrestler staged a huge semifinal comeback before being edged by London's Mark Crockett 3-0. The Spartans' medal count was rounded out with a bronze by 77 kg. cadet Steve Shortt.

Ferrier, Smith and Chan will now represent the school at next month's Ontario Winter Games in Guelph. Shortt enjoys alternate status and could still join the others. Meanwhile, Knock has qualified for this spring's nationals in Fredericton, New Brunswick. Canadian cadet entries will be determined at the Ontario Winter Games.


