

### Guards walk off job due to safety worries; prison is locked down

Maplehurst inmates spent the weekend confined to their cells after 50 correctional officers walked off the job Friday following the discovery of a contraband smuggling scheme.

Bill Yole, a spokesperson for Ontario Public Service Employees Union Local 234 and co-chair of the health and safety committee at Maplehurst, said the guards launched a brief work stoppage because prison officials failed to initiate a facilitywide search when the smuggling scheme was discovered Tuesday.
