Local boxer unbeaten since his move to Bramalea club


New surroundings have met with favourable results for Matt Hart Jr.

Attaining his desired middleweight status, the local pugilist earned a unanimous decision over Brantford's Shane Summerhaze.

Hart Jr. connected with a thunderous left hook to the mid-section in the opening round and had his opponent reeling through the balance of the contest with a quick combination of head and body shots.

"I could hear him wince after that first body shot," said Hart Jr. "He just didn't know which way to go after that. I was working my angles pretty good and just managed to stay focused the whole fight."

pared," he explained. Hart Jr. — Milton's only known active boxer — is next in action this weekend, during a province-vs.province showdown in Quebec.




