Haydar powers Wildcats to Hockey East championship

Two down, one to go.

Darren (Mini) Haydar's New Hampshire University Wildcats crossed another item off their to-do list Saturday night at Boston's FleetCenter — capturing their first-ever Hockey East title with a 3-1 victory over arch-rival Maine.

And UNH's senior captain — who in recent years has become a highly dependable under-pressure performer — fueled the championship win by assisting on both third-period goals to cement the tournament finals.

Saturday's triumph put the brakes on a six-game playoff losing skid against

"It's exciting," said Haydar, who one night earlier collected a couple of points to beat UMass Lowell 4-3 and ended the weekend as the Hockey East Tournament MVP. "It took four years but we finally did it. We (seniors) knew it was our last chance and we had to make our best attempt.

"At the start of the year we had three goals: one to win the regular season, two to win the Hockey East title and three, obviously to win the national championship. We're two-thirds of the way there."

According to the Merchant, Hampshire went into last weekend's final four feeling very little pres-- despite being the number one seed.

Recalled Haydar, "We kind of took a look reverse things and said 'We've never won

this thing before, so we've got nothing to lose'." Showing just why he's now officially in

the running for the coveted Hobey Baker Award, Haydar delivered picturesque passes to teammates Sean Collins and Steve Saviano for the game-winner and insurance marker respectively. His efforts on the go-ahead goal were

particularly impressive, as he won a crucial corner battle while UNH had the manadvantage and shoveled it out to an incoming Collins - who made no mistake with a top-shelf wrister.

Saviano scored in similar fashion to punctuate a big forecheck turnover initiated by Haydar — who sits second in the

nation's points race with 74.

He said, "Obviously I've had a good year, but individual success comes from team success. We all work hard and I seem to be taking all the credit."

Modesty aside, the local sniper is arguably the biggest reason why New Hampshire sits on the verge of a trip to next month's Frozen Four.

All that stands in the team's way is a Sunday afternoon victory over either Cornell or Quinnipiac, who'll do battle during the NCAA Tournament's opening Worchester, in round tomorrow Massachusetts.

While he's come up short in both cracks at the national title since joining UNH, Haydar's Wildcats now go in as one of the favourites — and are 6-1-2 against their potential opponents.

That record includes an early-season win over Denver, who up until this month held top spot in the national rankings.

"They're a tight defensive club, so we've just got to work hard down low and not make any mistakes," said Haydar of a possible New Hampshire/Denver match-up.

If successful Sunday, UNH will advance to the Frozen Four in St. Paul, Minnesota April 4 to 6.
