
# Bertoli and Titans deliver big finish to regular season

Miltonian Scott Bertoli and his ECHL Trenton Titans wrapped up the regular season by reaching a couple of impressive milestones this past weekend.

Bertoli — a third-year veteran of the semi-pro league — broke the 70-point mark with two goals and an assist in the final week, which was capped with Saturday's 3-2 decision over Atlantic City.

Finishing 21st in league scoring this season, the former Milton Merchant and Princeton Tiger collected 25 goals and 46 assists in 69 games. A well-rounded left winger used on both the powerplay and penalty killing units, he ended the year at a plus-24 and amassed 125 penalty minutes.

Meanwhile, his Titans surpassed the 100-point plateau — finishing two points above that mark —

with an undefeated final week. Their 46-16-10 record was good enough for top spot in the Northeastern Conference and second overall, behind Louisiana.

Bertoli — who earned a tryout with the Washington Capitals last fall and has earned three onegame call-ups to the AHL in the past two seasons — will now look to deliver another impressive playoff run.

Trenton begins its quest for a second straight trip to the Kelly Cup championship finals this weekend against Roanoke.

## Hurricanes take fourth in OMHA

So close, so agonizingly close.

Just one win — or two goals, depending on how you look at it — separated Halton's AAA major atoms from OMHA hardware late last month.

The Barrie Icemen eventually exacted revenge in the bronze-medal clash, trimming the Hurricanes 5-4. Matt Clark scored in the battle for third while fellow Miltonian Ryan Mitchell picked up an assist.

Halton drew within a goal during an exciting third period, but just couldn't sink the equalizer.

The bronze-medal game served as pay-back for Halton's 2-0 shutout victory in the tournament's opening round. Miltonian Ryan Williams delivered dynamite goaltending for the goose egg, while Mitchell was

among the play-makers.

The Hurricanes would manage just one more victory in their next three round robin games, which wasn't quite good enough for a trip to the finals.

They trounced the Clarington Toros 8-3 in the third round — thanks in large part to a four-point performance by Mitchell. Clark potted a single in the lopsided triumph.

Sandwiching this win were 5-4 and 7-1 defeats to the Markham Waxers and Stoney Creek Icebreakers respectively.

The Milton-based trio showed strongly all year to help the major atoms reach the OMHA championship tournament.




