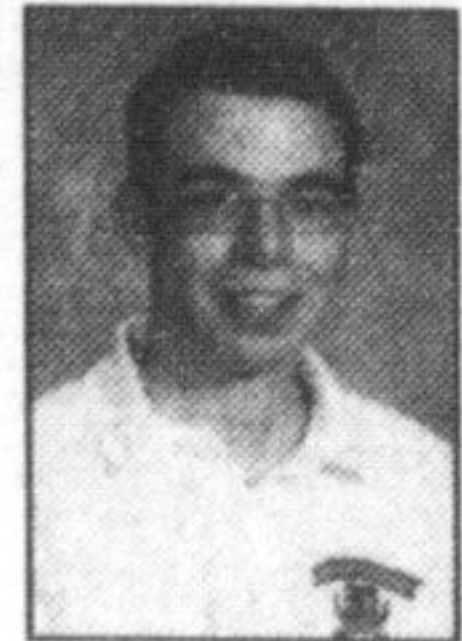

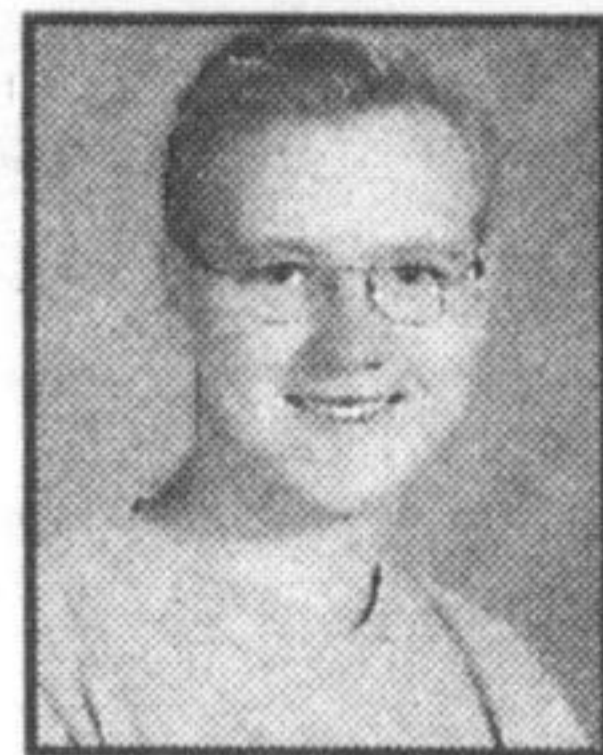

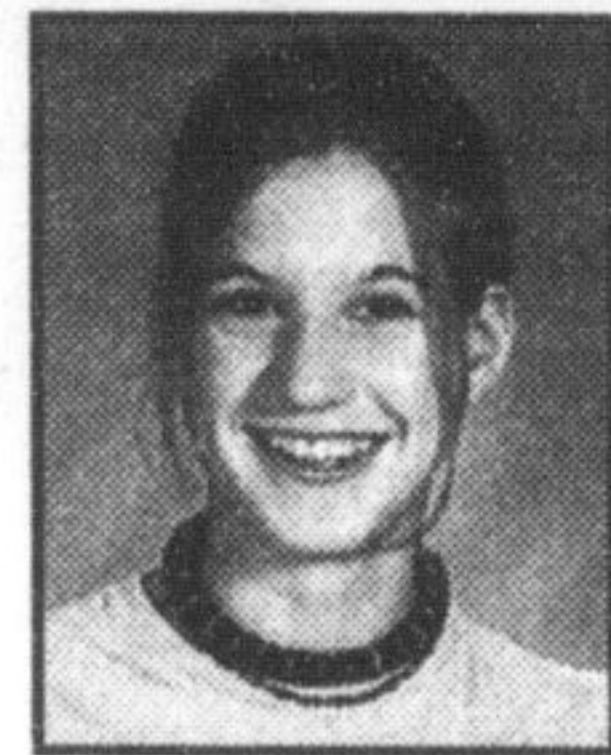

Well another short week ends, and another weekend begins and soon it will be Monday morning, enjoy the weekend.

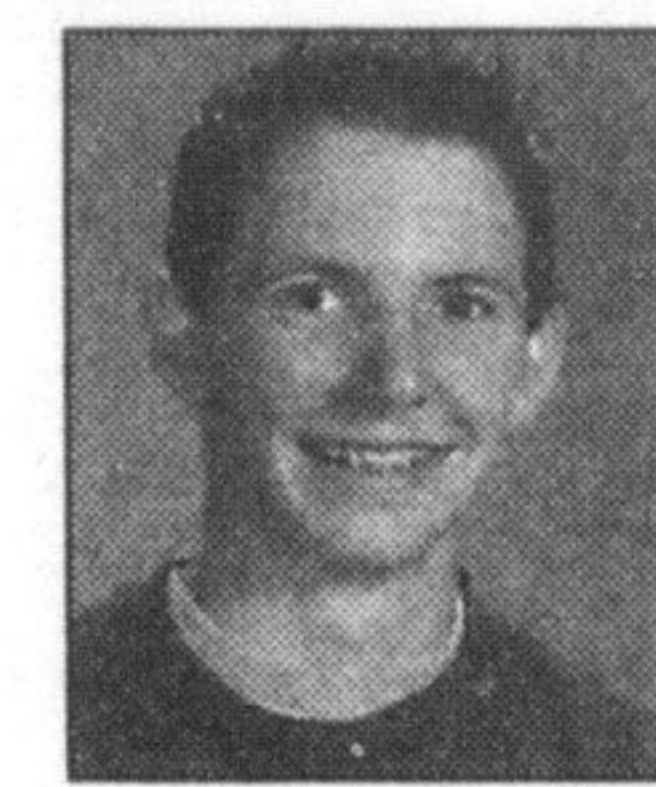
ONCE UPON A DATELINE DRURY

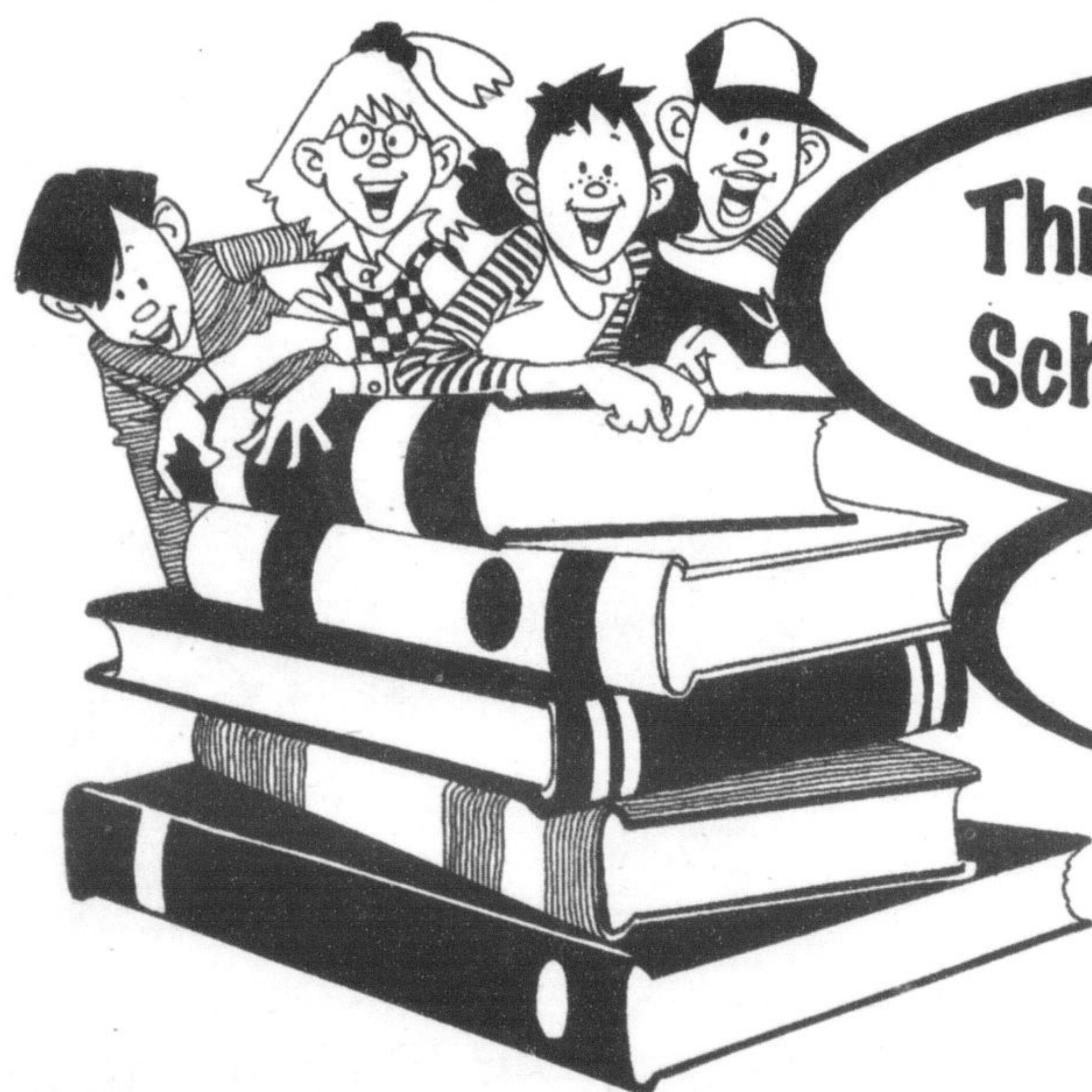
Robblestiltskin
