

Police set to launch annual seatbelt blitz

It's time to buckle up.

All police forces in Ontario — including Halton Regional Police and the Cambridge and Port Credit OPP — are joining forces in the Provincial Seatbelt Campaign, which runs from tomorrow to April 27.

Officers will be out in the communities to ensure seat belt compliance rates remain high throughout the region. The focus of this year's campaign will be child restraints, with the emphasis on the safety of children in car seats and child passenger safety laws.

"Our enforcement initiative combined with education will ensure high compliance rates and reduce the dangers related to lack of use of seatbelts and lack of child restraints which may result in serious injury during motor vehicle collisions," said Sgt. Trevor Hay of the Halton Regional Traffic Bureau.

Under the Ontario Highway Traffic Act, there are specific laws pertaining to the use of seat belts, as well as the responsibility of the driver to ensure the proper seat belt is worn by passengers under the age of 16.
