



Ferrier earns bronze at nationals

Drury freshman caps impressive year with medal at Canadian Cadet event

Gary Ferrier punctuated this season's wrestling campaign with a huge exclamation mark last weekend in Fredericton, New Brunswick.

Capping an impressive high school freshman year that included a top-eight finish at OFSAA, E.C. Drury's promising 57-kilogram grappler captured bronze in his debut at the national cadet championships.

The only blemish to Ferrier's 7-1 performance came in round two when he was upstaged, surprisingly enough for a national event, by an opponent from New York.

The Canadian showcase — much to the dismay of many coaches has traditionally been open to wrestlers on both sides of the bor-

Ferrier fell short against his more seasoned American rival, but prevailed at every other turn.

His half-dozen wins included a

pinfall victory and three grand superiority decisions.

In the bronze medal bout, he trailed much of the way against Sarnia's Rinnier Carrillo but delivered a last-minute power reversal which inadvertently separated Carrillo's shoulder — bringing a premature end to what had been up to that point a highly-entertaining showdown.

Ferrier knocked off opponents from three other provinces and one territory to reach the third-place bout. His stiffest preliminary challenge came from Nunavet's Daniel Young, who matched him movefor-move before getting beat 6-4.

The bronze was his eight medal of the season and lifted his overall win count to 36.

Meanwhile, E.C. Drury's Carl Chan also competed at last weekend's nationals and earned valuable experience as well as a victory over a host-province grappler.


